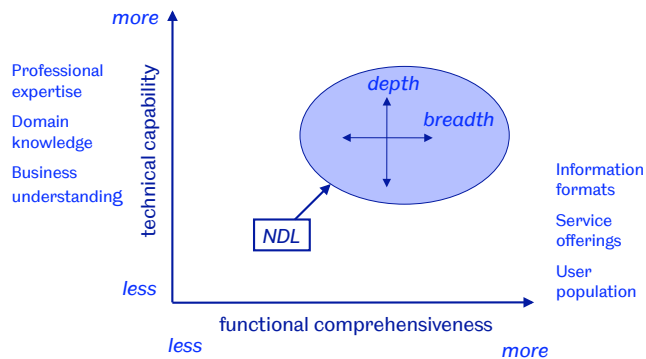

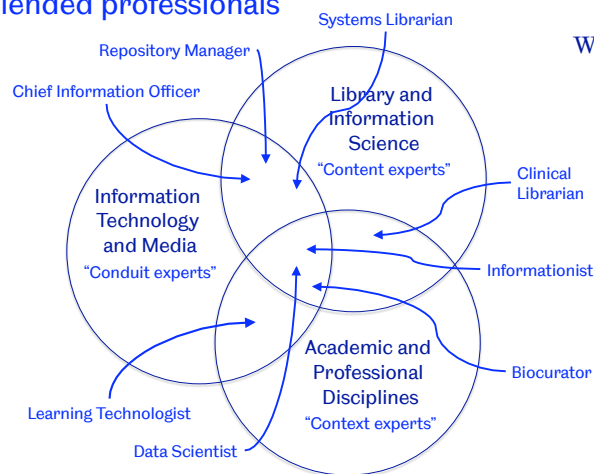

Information professionals are expected to deliver a diverse portfolio of highly specialised services (Corrall, 2005)

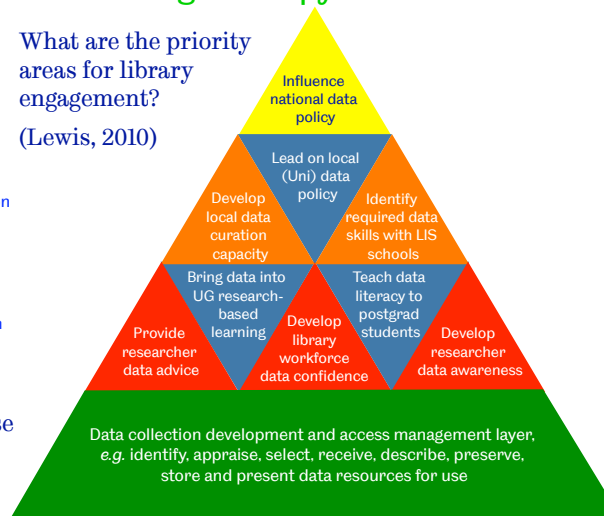
Blended professionals



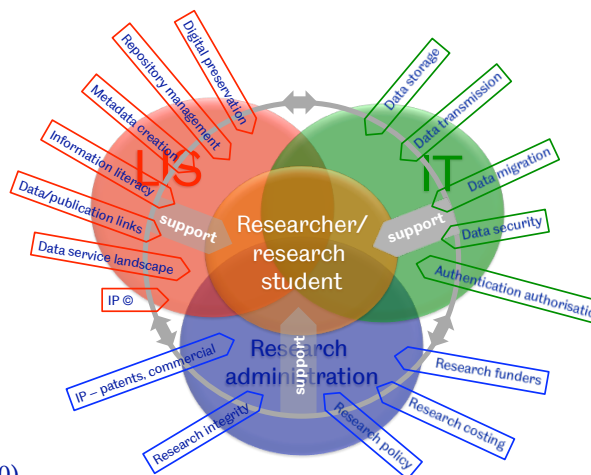
Blended specialist roles have emerged at the boundaries of established professions (Corrall & Lester, 1996; Corrall, 2010)

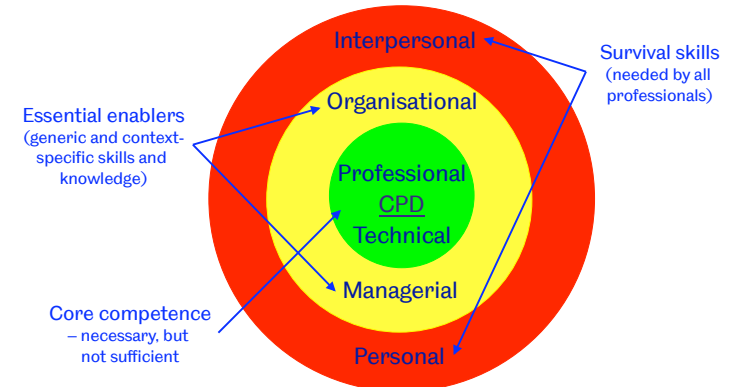

Collaborative service development



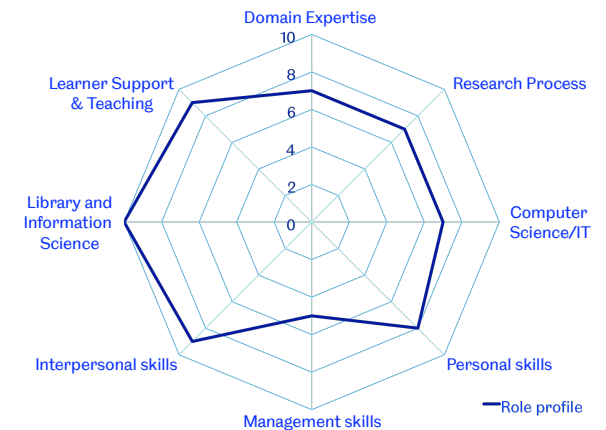
Professional competence
