Workshop organisers

This workshop is organised by the Digital Curation Centre, the California Digital Library and the DART project. The aim is to bring together people undertaking work on Data Management Plans (DMPs) to provide an international forum for sharing lessons and expertise. The DART project methodology for developing an evaluation rubric will also be used in a practical exercise on reviewing DMPs.

Brief description

Lots of developments are happening in terms of DMPs – new requirements are emerging, the number of national pilots is growing, and librarians are starting to offer DMP review services. Come to this workshop to hear about what is going on in different contexts and share details from your work. You will also get the opportunity to learn how to develop an evaluation rubric, based on the lessons of the DART project, to help you review and assess DMPs in your own context.

Long description

This one-day workshop will profile how researchers are being supported with DMPs in different contexts. We will hear from national pilot projects and different institutions about how they are developing tools and support services. We will also discuss how this work can be better coordinated, and provide an opportunity for you to bring along examples from your own work to share with others.

The afternoon session will focus on processes and outcomes of formal DMP review. There will be a few presentations about various efforts to review DMPs in the US, Europe and the UK to provide examples and lessons. These will be followed by an opportunity for attendees to learn how to develop an analytic rubric to assess sample DMPs for adherence to funder guidelines. Based on the interests of participants, we will choose a few relevant funder requirements for the exercise, for example the European Commission's Horizon 2020 expectations, the US National Institute of Health and the UK Engineering and Physical Sciences Research Council.
