

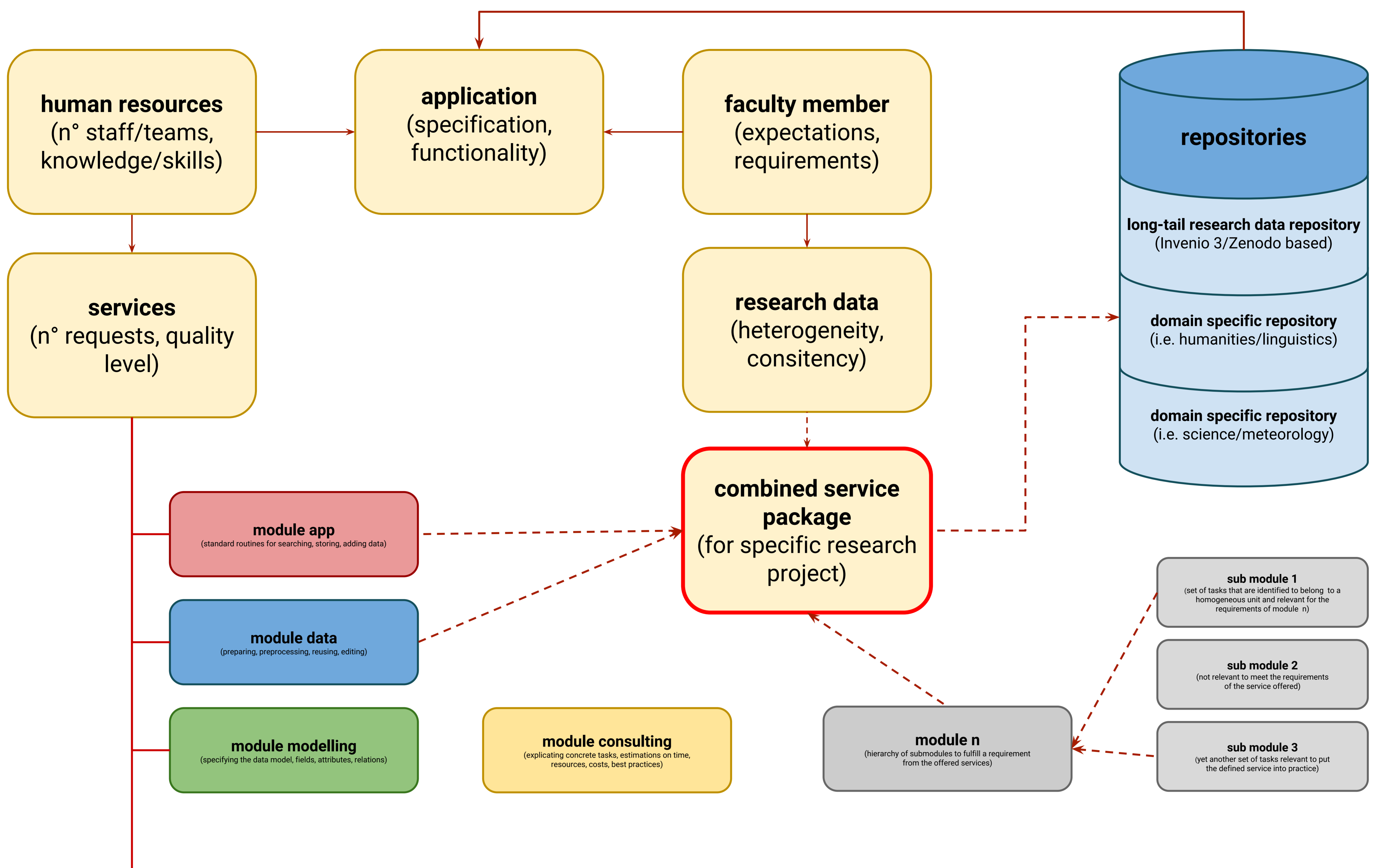
Systematizing Curation Tasks: Workflow Modularization and Impact Factors of Data Curation Services

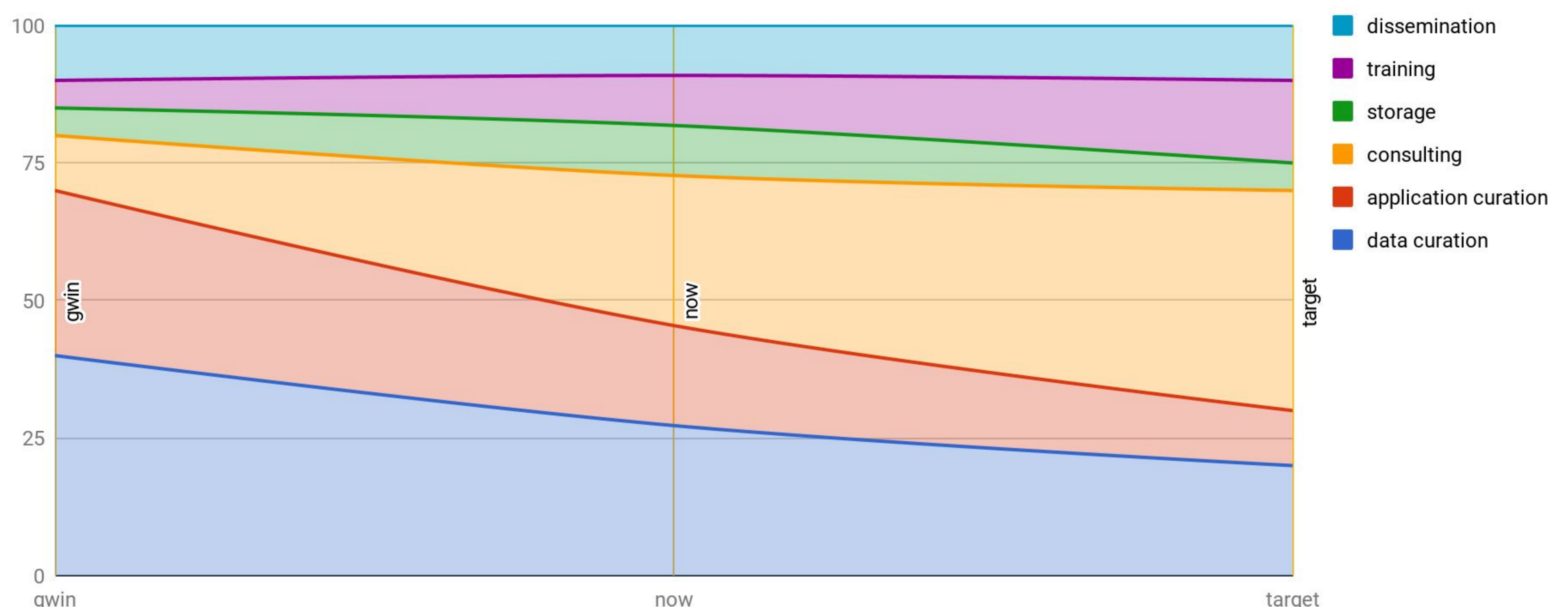
The **Center for Sustainable Research Data Management (RDM Center)** is a central institution of the Universität Hamburg, which is assigned to the Vice-President for Research (VP3). The RDM Center bundles infrastructures, competencies and tasks as well as in the Regional Computing Center (RRZ) in order to offer sustainable services.

Task/Problem: Transform and expand Research Data Management and Curation Services from the Humanities Faculty to the entire University.

Approach: Optimize (as opposed to mere scaling) supply of services and enlarge the degree of standardization of core competencies in a redesign of modules that can be flexibly arranged to the needs of each faculty.

Conclusion: Widening the scope of research data management from the data and applications of only one (albeit very heterogeneous) faculty to all faculties of a university calls for a defined set of service-modules.

Yet, with limited resources, it is clear that not every chunk of data or every specialized research application can be curated. It is still the upmost goal of our center to mitigate this drawback by standardization and service modularization.
